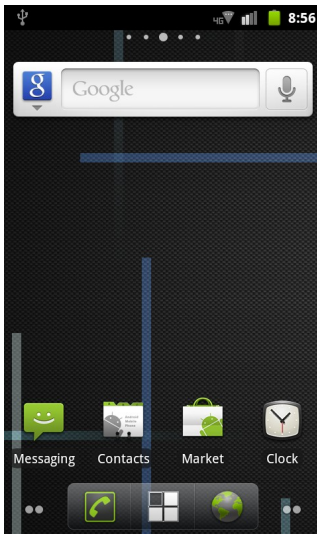
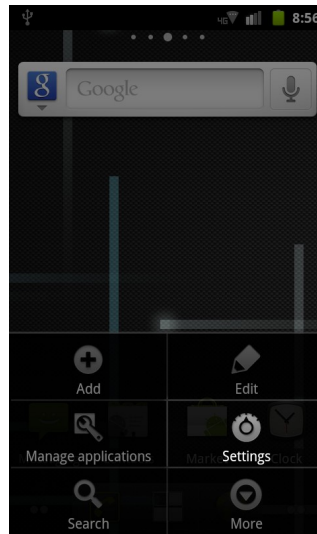


Connecting Android devices to su-pirate Android v. 2.2 and above

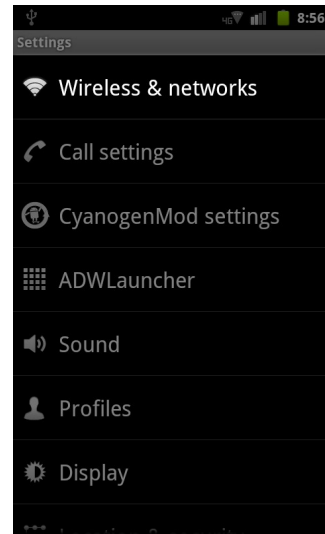
su-pirate is the name of the secure network at Southwestern. In order to connect your Android device to the **su-pirate** network, a few configuration steps are required. Once these are completed, you will not need to do them again to connect your device to the **su-pirate** network.



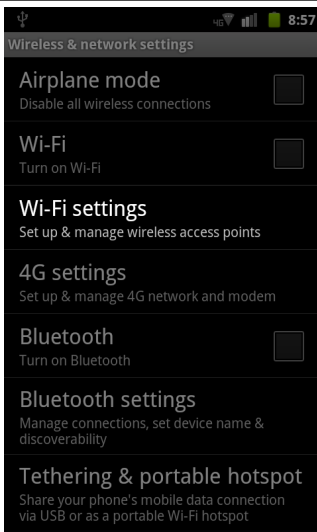
1. Press the **Menu** button on your device. If you do not know which button is the Menu button, consult your manual.



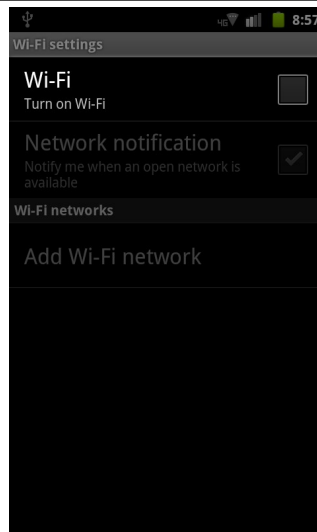
2. Tap **Settings** from the menu that appears.



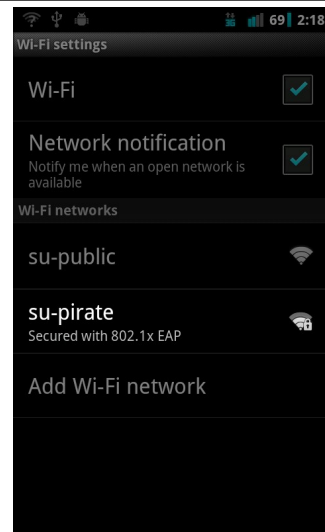
3. Tap **Wireless and Networks**.



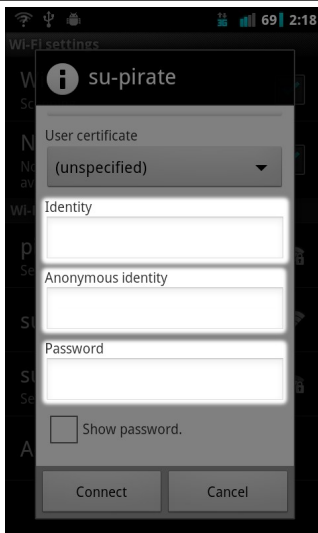
4. Tap **Wi-Fi settings**.



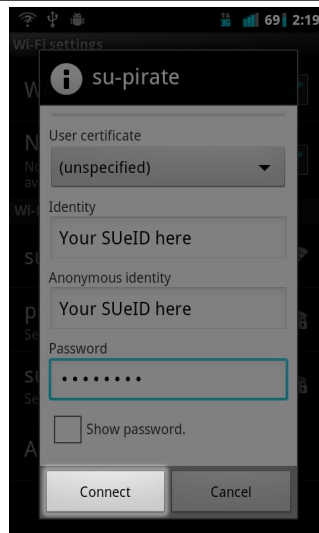
5. Tap the **Wi-Fi** check box to turn on Wi-Fi, if it's unchecked.



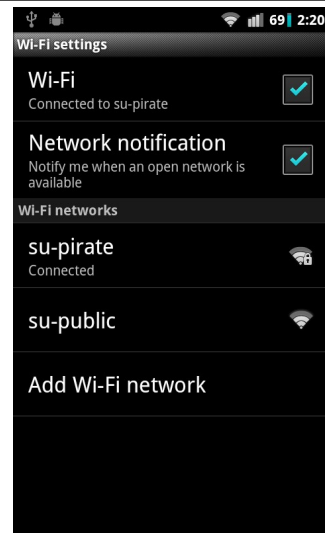
6. A list of wireless networks will appear after a few seconds. Tap on **su-pirate**.



7. In the window that appears, enter the following information: In the **Identity** and **Anonymous Identity** boxes, enter your **SUeID**. In the **Password** box, enter your **SUeID password**.



8. Tap the **Connect** button.
Note: If you're unable to see the button, your on-screen keyboard may be blocking it. Press the **Back** button on your device to close the on-screen keyboard.



9. Wait a few seconds while your identity is verified. Upon successful connection, the text "**Connected**" will appear beneath **su-pirate**.
