








Connecting Your Mac to su-pirate OSX 10.4 and above

su-pirate is the name of the secure network at Southwestern. In order to connect your Mac to the **su-pirate** network, a few configuration steps are required. Once these are completed, you will not need to do them again to connect your device to the **su-pirate** network.

 <p>1. Click on the Airport Icon in your menu bar. Note: if the menu that appears says "AirPort: Off", click the "Turn AirPort On" menu option.</p>	 <p>2. In the list of wireless networks that appears, click on su-pirate.</p>	 <p>3. In the window that appears, enter your SUeID in the User Name box, and your SUeID password in the Password box.</p>
 <p>4. Click OK. Note: A window may pop up titled Verify Certificate. If this happens, follow steps 5 - 7.</p>	 <p>5. In the Verify Certificate window, click the Continue button.</p>	 <p>6. Enter your Local Computer's login name in the Name box, and your Local Computer's password in the Password box. This is the user name and password required to log into your computer, and is asked only once.</p>
 <p>7. Click the OK button.</p>	<p>8. The Airport Icon should display a signal strength if you've connected successfully.</p>
