







Connecting Windows 7 and Vista to **su-pirate** For 32-bit and 64-bit systems

su-pirate is the name of the secure network at Southwestern. In order to connect your PC to the **su-pirate** network, a few configuration steps are required. Once these are completed, you will not need to do them again to connect your device to the **su-pirate** network.

 <p>1. Ensure your computer's wireless is turned on, then click the Wireless icon in your taskbar, near the clock. Note: if you do not know how to turn on wireless on your computer, consult your computer's manual or contact the Help Desk.</p>	 <p>2. In the list of wireless networks that appears, click on su-pirate</p>	 <p>3. Click the Connect button.</p>
 <p>4. Enter your SUeID in the User name box, and your SUeID password in the password box.</p>	 <p>5. Click the OK button.</p>	 <p>6. A Windows Security Alert window will pop up. This is normal. Click the Connect button.</p>
<p>7. Wait a few seconds and your wireless icon in the task bar should show your signal strength, indicating a successful connection.</p>
