Minimum Total Credits: 127

A "C" average (2.0 or better) on all work attempted (overall and within the major or minor) is required for graduation. No grade below "C-" may be counted toward the required hours in the major, minor, or area of concentration. A minimum of 64 credits must be upper-level. No more than 56 credits may be credited in one subject area. At least 64 credits must be completed at Southwestern, including the last 32 credits.

A major requires at least 30 credits, 60 percent upper-level. Sixty percent of the major must be completed at SU, and at least half of the SU hours must be upper-level. A minor (optional) requires at least 18 credits, 12 upper-level (at least 12 credits at SU with 8 of those upper-level).

An independent major (area of concentration), approved by the departments and divisions involved, consists of at least 56 credits (28 from one department, 20 upper-level; 28 additional credits, 20 upper-level). Of the 56 credits, 34 must be completed at SU (17 upper-level).
