Three influences in learning about mathematical logic

I had influence from three people on logic. Basically, one was a priest that taught law in a private school, in a Jesuit private school. He taught me about Aristotle, the law, and how you tie things together through implication. Then I had my advisor, my Master's advisor, who is very logical, very reasonable. And the third person who had a lot of influence in me with logic was my boss, who I currently work at University of Miami. About 10-12 years ago he had his Ph.D. in mathematical logic and he opened the way for me to understand a little bit of the foundations of math and mathematical logic.
