A "C" average on all work attempted is required for graduation. No grade below "C-" may be counted toward the major or minor. At least 127 credits are required to earn a degree at Southwestern; of these, 64 credits must be completed in residence, including the last 32 credits. No more than 56 credit hours may be counted in one subject area. A major requires at least 30 credits, more than 50% upper-level, and a minor (optional) requires at least 18 credits (at least 12 upper-level). 60% of the major credits and 12 minor credits must be completed in residence at SU. With the exception of FRAs and the FY/AES seminar, all gen. ed. requirements require a minimum of 3 credits, including Fine Arts Performance.
