At least 127 credits are required to earn a degree at Southwestern; of these, 64 credits must be completed in residence, including the last 32 credits. No more than 56 credit hours may be counted in one subject area. A major requires at least 30 credits, 60% upper-level, and a minor (optional) requires at least 18 credits (at least 12 upper-level).
