



The Ouida Henderson Endowed Scholarship Fund was established in 2013 by Henderson family to provide scholarships to benefit the young women of Delta Delta Delta. The scholarship is dedicated to honor their mother who was an active member of this sorority.

The Allison Dickson Scholarship Fund was established in 2014 by Allison Dickson to provide scholarships to members of Delta Delta Delta who have financial need.

Instructions:

Please complete the attached application and submit it to the Financial Aid Office by **May 1, 2019**. So that the scholarship selection committee may have access to your transcript, be sure to sign your application before you submit it. You may answer questions using a separate sheet of paper.

Who may apply for these scholarships?

Any member of the Delta Delta Delta sorority may apply if:

- (1) is an active member in good standing with the sorority,
- (2) plans to enroll at the university during the 2019-20 academic year on a full-time basis and,
- (3) is making satisfactory academic progress for financial aid purposes (i.e., 2.0 cumulative GPA, completed at least 80% of all credit hours attempted, and earned no more than 175 credit hours.)

If I am currently a pledge, may I apply for this scholarship?

Yes. You may apply for the scholarship as a pledge. Scholarship recipients must be active members in good standing with the fraternity during the period in which the award is granted.

If I meet the criteria above, does this mean I will automatically receive the scholarship?

No. These are competitive scholarships and the recipients will be selected from the pool of applicants for the scholarships.

How are the recipients selected?

Applications are solicited through announcements to the Delta Delta Delta Sorority. Scholarship candidates will identify themselves by completing a scholarship application, which must be submitted to the Financial Aid Office by May 1, 2019. Applications are reviewed by the Financial Aid Office. An applicant demonstrated need, academic record, and record of involvement in the University community are factors in the selection process. All applicants will be notified of their final status in writing by June 30, 2019.

What are the amounts of the scholarships and how many are available?

The amounts for the 2019-2020 school year have yet to be determined. The number and amount of awards will be influenced by the number and quality of applications received. The Financial Aid Office will determine who will receive the scholarships, and in what amounts (Dickson Scholarship will have input from Allison).

What are the durations of the scholarships?

Both scholarships are awarded annually and are good for one year. The scholarships must be used during the regular academic year. The scholarships may not be used for summer school or for any type of program where SU funds may not be used, such as non-SU study abroad programs or the GLCA New York Semester.

Is the scholarship renewable?

The scholarships are awarded for one year only and are not renewable. However, recipients may re-apply each year to be considered along with all other applicants for that year.
