

ACADEMIC WARNING SYSTEM

WHAT?

A program to identify students who demonstrate signs of academic distress in order to connect these students to resources on campus.

The AWS allows you to share the following student concerns:

- not attending class regularly
- missing quizzes or exams
- not participating in class
- performing poorly on an assignment or an exam
- failing to turn in assignments
- difficulty with level of work
- struggling with written assignments
- studying ineffectively

You may also leave a comment to the student encouraging next steps and resources.

Students identified through the online AWS receive an immediate e-mail containing helpful information about available campus resources. Their advisors receive a copy of the email, as well.

Please submit an alert even if you have discussed the concern with the student directly.

WHEN?

The online version of the AWS will be available beginning the 3rd week of the semester through WebAdvisor.

WHO?

All faculty! All students!

HOW?

Be on the lookout for an email from Jennifer Leach with details on how to access the online AWS through WebAdvisor.

WHY?

Historically, at least 75% of the students who receive an Academic Warning System are in Good Standing (2.0 GPA) at the end of the semester.
