



This Endowed Scholarship Fund was established in 2007 by Alumnae of the Zeta Chapter of Alpha Delta Pi to provide scholarships to benefit the members of Alpha Delta Pi sorority who have financial need.

Instructions:

Please complete the attached application and submit it to the Financial Aid Office by **March 2, 2020**. So that the scholarship selection committee may have access to your transcript, be sure to sign your application before you submit it. You may answer questions using a separate sheet of paper.

Who may apply for these scholarships?

Any member of the Alpha Delta Pi sorority may apply if:

- (1) is an active member in good standing with the sorority,
- (2) demonstrate financial need
- (3) plans to enroll at the university during the 2020-21 academic year on a full-time basis and,
- (4) is making satisfactory academic progress for financial aid purposes (i.e., 2.0 cumulative GPA, completed at least 80% of all credit hours attempted, and earned no more than 175 credit hours.)
- (5) who demonstrates the highest levels of academic excellence and/or leadership in the University community

If I am currently an Alpha member, may I apply for this scholarship?

Yes. Alpha members may apply for the scholarship. Scholarship recipients must be active members in good standing with the sorority during the period in which the award is granted.

If I meet the criteria above, does this mean I will automatically receive the scholarship?

No. This is a competitive scholarship and the recipient(s) will be selected from the pool of applicants for the scholarship.

How are the recipients selected?

Applications are solicited through announcements to the membership of the Alpha Delta Pi sorority. Scholarship candidates will identify themselves by completing a scholarship application, which must be submitted to the Financial Aid Office by March 2, 2020. Applications are reviewed by a selection committee of Alpha Delta Pi – Zeta Chapter alumni, in consultation with the Financial Aid Office. An applicant's demonstrated need, academic record, and record of involvement in the University community are factors in the selection process. All applicants will be notified of their final status in writing by April 1, 2020.

What is the amount of the scholarship and how many are available?

The amount available for the 2020-21 school year is undetermined at this time. The number and amount of awards will be influenced by the number and quality of applications received. The selection committee will determine who will receive the scholarships, and in what amounts.

What is the duration of the scholarships?

The scholarship is awarded annually and is good for one year. The scholarship must be used during the regular academic year. The scholarship may not be used for summer school or for any type of program where SU funds may not be used, such as non-SU study abroad programs or the GLCA New York Semester.

Is the scholarship renewable?

The scholarship is awarded for one year only and is not renewable. However, recipients may re-apply each year to be considered along with all other applicants for that year.

You may check your FAFSA status at www.fafsa.gov or contact the Financial Aid Office at (512) 863-1259 or at finaid@southwestern.edu. Applicants without a FAFSA on file, with a rejected FAFSA, or with incomplete verification documents will not be considered.
